
Below is a Roll of Honour showing the **193** names of the known men and women from Aysgarth Parish who served during the Great War 1914-1918. It seeks to commemorate all who served, not just those who lost their lives. Those who made the ultimate sacrifice are shown with a poppy alongside their names. 🌹

The population of Aysgarth Parish in 1911 was **1,229**. Names are listed in the village in which they were either born or residing at the time of the conflict, (total in brackets).
